Introduction

Classification is the key process that ensures labels and safety data sheets (SDS) provide **accurate information on hazards**, helping recipients use your chemical products safely. Whether you formulate mixtures yourself, import formulations from outside of the **UK**, or export formulations to the EU, you need to understand the principles and requirements of the **Classification, Labelling and Packaging (CLP) Regulation** in order to make sure your labels and SDS are correct and compliant with the regulations.

This one-day workshop, delivered over two half day sessions, aims to give you an understanding of your duties under both EU and GB CLP, as well as practical skills to help you classify and label your products correctly. The day is ideal for anyone who needs to understand more about their obligations under the CLP regulations in both the **EU27 and UK**.

Who should attend?

Aimed at companies that either **import mixtures** from non-UK suppliers or **formulate** their own products. Anyone responsible for classification and labelling, as well as those accountable for wider product stewardship issues should attend. The day will be of particular value to anyone **new to classification**, but it will also benefit those with experience of classifying mixtures under the **EU CLP Regulations**.

- ✓ Improve your understanding of CLP and the impact of classification on other regulations,
- ✓ Define your company's role and its duties for hazard communication and notification,
- ✓ Understand the basics of the classification process,
- ✓ Carry out classifications for key hazard classes,
